Her first album, 'Song to a Seagull' was released shortly after. The album became a smash hit and Joni an overnight success. Her second album, 'Clouds' put her among the ranks of international concert artists and she is now one of the most important contemporary song-writers on the scene. When not writing songs, Joni paints and all her album sleeves feature her own paintings.

American JAMES TAYLOR was born into a highly musical family – brother Livingston and sister Kate are almost as well-known on the folk scene as James himself, - so it is not surprising that he showed an early interest in music. He played alto and learned music theory at school. However, he never really liked any kind of formal study so tought himself to play guitar. About five years ago James formed his first group, The Flying Machine, and wrote a lot of songs while he was with them. The group broke up a year later but James carried on with his songwriting. He came to London where he met Peter Asher of Apple and instead of doing the sightseeing he had planned ended up in a recording studio. James, who describes his music as 'green rock 'n' roll', has, like JONI MITCHELL, reached the ranks of International concert artists. His albums always sell by the million and, in fact, 'Sweet Baby James has sold over two million.






