MANY people think of running their own disco, but when they consider the problems of getting the right gear together they problem in a book ings, they five ling book in a book in a

Firstly you need a good
Discotheque console.
This must have twin
decks, mixer with faders
for deck 1 and deck 2, and for deck 1 and deck 2, and a separate mic channel. Also very important is a headphone monitoring facility, so you can start your records on cue (some people call thisten). Next you need a good ampliffer. The ideal power rating for small to medium sized gigs would be 70-100 watts (check that the power rating is RMS watta as this gives the true rating). Then all the true rating). Then all you need are speakers to match your amp, microphone and headphones.
There are many firms

making and selling disco gear around the country so you have plenty of choice, and the price you would have to pay for a complete sound system would range from 1200 -1400. The only extra apart from records would be a from records would be a lighting system, which would cost around 176 complete. If you look around, and choose carefully, you can put your first disco on the road for around 1300. If you haven't got the ready cash most firms offer 197 so all you have to find is the deposit. the deposit.
