Folksingers Arlo Guthrie and Joni Mitchell make the Sounds of Summer scene at 7 tonight on Channel 10 in a two-hour color program. It will feature highlights from their concert at the Mississippi River Festival plus an interview with the young performers.

Arlo Guthrie, author of the recent hit recording, "Alice's Restaurant," and son of the immortal Woody Guthrie, is one of the most popular folksingers today. Like Joni Mitchell, he writes most of his own material, and his songs are included in the folksong repertory.
